Edith lived in East Germany when American troops during WW2 led by General Patton occupied Muhlhausen in January 1945. She was hired, along with other German citizens, to assist in translating records at a branch of Buchenwald outside of Muhlhausen. She attended school in Germany. Edith and her husband Jack were long residents of the Tucson area. She worked as an accountant for several years in Flagstaff and Phoenix. She was the past president of the Green Valley Women's Club and past president of the National Secretary Association in Phoenix. She loved ballroom dancing, cooking, playing the accordion, entertaining, traveling, knitting and crocheting. Edith's family will miss her greatly. Rest in peace mama and grandma. We all love you! Edith was preceded in death by her husband Jack Easter in 2011.
